



In order to prevent the potential spread of the virus when cricket coaching returns, and to ensure the safety of both coaches and children, West End Esher cricket Club will be implementing a number of measures. For example, no equipment whatsoever will be shared during a coaching session.

All parents will be emailed prior to cricket coaching session commencement with the following stipulations:

- Children, or children of parents who are displaying any symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are not permitted to join part of a West End Esher Cricket Club coaching session for a two week period
 - These include:
 - **a high temperature** – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
 - **a new, continuous cough** – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
 - **a headache or dizziness** – this is in addition to guidelines set out by the health care department
- Parents should observe the social distancing guidelines when on the West End Green .
- All children must wash their hands for 20 seconds (or use hand sanitiser) before joining a West End Esher Cricket Club coaching session, as well as directly after finishing
- There will be a minimum 10 minute gap between two consecutive coaching sessions. This is to allow parents and children from the first coaching session to leave before the new group begin arriving
- Parents are only permitted to bring children 5 minutes before their coaching session begins
- Every child's temperature will be taken prior to coaching session
- Parents are to maintain a social distance of at least 2 meters from each other at all times whilst their child participates in a coaching session.

Prior to a coaching session beginning, all Coaches will have the following procedures and equipment in place: Coaches will take their own temperature and log it on the coaches record form. If this is raised above normal, the Coach is required to report this to the welfare officer of the club and will not be allowed to run any sessions for 14 days.

- All equipment will be sterilised using a two-step process directly after a coaching session
 - First: All equipment will be wiped using cleaning spray
 - Second: All equipment will be sterilised using disinfectant wipes or disinfectant spray
- Each child will have their own individual equipment in their designated area to maintain social distancing
- Coaches will have a bottle of hand sanitiser aerosol spray to be used by children in the rare occasions that equipment is unintentionally handled by more than one child.

Coaches will have a non-contact infrared thermometer. This will be used to check every child's temperature prior to class beginning. All children with a temperature above normal will not be permitted to take part in the session
